5	Bridleway crossing to Lakes, south of Whyke Road Roundabout must be kept clear of vegetation to ensure visibility	Visibility
6	B2145 from A27 to Sidlesham. Varying speed limits: 40, 50, 30, 40, 30, 50 mph	Dangerous inconsistency of speed, particularly entering Hunston on bend
7	B2145 through Hunston, regular speeding – one death due to speeding in the last 10 years. Frequent near misses	Speed
8	Green Lane to Donnington rat run to avoid A27. Should not be free speed limit – should be 30mph	Rat run + reduce speed limit
8a	Undsafe crossing B2145 – NCN2 and 288	50 – 30 mph limits – poor visibility

24	Crooked Lane near Birdham School	Rat Run – speed reduction
24a	Bus stop opposite Church Lane on South East side requires remodelling for passengers to get on and off	Unsafe bus stop

25	Rat Runs – Acre Street, Chapel Lane, Elms Lane, Itchenor/West Wittering – avoids B2179	Rat Runs – slow speed
26	Junction of Rookwood Lane, Salterns Way and Rookwood Road at Malthouse Corner	Concern for safety of cyclists leaving Salterns Way
27	West Wittering (Cakeham Rd B2179 between Wellsfield and Summerfield Road). Dangerous where cycle lanes end and join pavement. Police aware – working on TRO	Traffic conflict with pedestrians and cyclists
28	Term time issue around school in Pound Road. Families have to park in Witterings pub and cross main road with small children on the bend with fast traffic rushing to the beach e.g. Grundon and Bideford Lorries. Also, very difficult for children on bicycles. This road is an important school route	Dangerous crossing for school children
29	Piggery Hall Lane/Chichester Road Junction. Used as route from East of the Village to the Chichester Road. Narrow and 40 mph. Are working on a TRO asking for a 30-mph limit as developers' lorries are speeding dangerously.	Reduce speed – accident risk. Police aware
30	Access to Huntland's Farm and Guy's Farm is a narrow, windy track, that joins the Chichester Road. Many near misses and a recent fatal accident	Dangerous junction – recent fatal accident
31	Two blind bends on B2198	Many accidents and near misses

32	Possible safe cycle route to Beach along existing pathways and tracks. Could connect to pathway to the east	Possible safe cycleway

Action points:

1. Data Collection from the magnetic indicators held by WSCC – give traffic speed and volume.
2. Park and ride for the whole of the Peninsula
3. Develop a slogan for the area to show it is a place for cyclists/walkers/horse riders e.g. Peninsula Paths for All
4. Understand historically there is a wide variation in speed limits. Along with traffic calming for all dangerous hot spots and rat runs, speed limits for all lanes/roads of 20mph. 30mph for B2145 and 40mph for A286.
